Bude:

Please come to the URC church via Killerton Road. There is disabled parking just outside the left side church entrance, and a limited number of parking spaces on the right side of the church. Of course, the parking spaces at our church will still be available.

Fr. Bernard's Golden Jubilee in the Parish Church at Charlton Kings was a splendid occasion. The church was packed, and the service was followed by a sit down buffet lunch for 150. Seven people represented St. Peters. Father Bernard has fond memories of the time that he spent in Bude. He asked that his thanks be given to all.

Launceston:

The Priest's chair: for some time I have felt awkward about hiding behind a pillar. I have moved my chair so that I am nearer to the people and facing them.

Receiving from the Chalice at Launceston: I have also been concerned that older folk and mums with young children are having to climb a step to get to the Ministers of Holy Communion. I have asked *one* Minister to stand at the edge of the step, near the server's bench, so that those who would rather not climb the step can receive our Lord on the same level. A number of you have suggested other ideas, but this seems to be the most practical. Do feel free to comment on both these changes.

Bishop Christopher Jubilee Fund for Seminarians: a year ago our Diocese raised £240,000 for the formation of men for the priesthood. You are encouraged to give something to top up the fund for future seminarians of whom there are several. If you can help, please take an envelope and return it with the regular collection. If you can gift-aid, even better. Forms are available.

The Catholic Children's Society has asked each parish to have a collecting box for more or less anything you would like to recycle. I'll leave it in the porch at Launceston and later on in the foyer at Bude. Look at the poster on the box for more details.
