The Year of Faith: from the Catechism of the Catholic Church (slightly adapted).

Paragraph 52: God wants to share his divine life with the men and women he created in order to adopt them as his children in his only-begotten Son.

Paragraph 56 and 71: After the unity of the human race was shattered by sin, God made an everlasting covenant with Noah and with all living things.

Paragraph 59 and 72: In order to gather together scattered humanity God calls Abram from his country and makes him Abraham, that is, “the father of a multitude of nations”. By the covenant on Mount Sinai God revealed his law to them through Moses. Through the prophets he prepared them to accept the salvation destined for all humanity.

Paragraph 63: Israel is the first priestly people of God, the first to hear his word.

Paragraph 64: Through the prophets God forms his people in the hope of salvation, in the expectation of a new and eternal Covenant intended for all, to be written on their hearts.

Paragraph 65 and 73: God has revealed himself fully by sending his own Son, the Father’s one, perfect and definitive Word. In him he has said everything; there will be no other word than this one.

Paragraph 66: Yet if the revelation is already complete, it has not been made completely explicit. It remains for our Faith gradually to grasp its full significance over the course of the centuries.

Paragraph 67: “Private” revelations do not belong to the deposit of faith, but they can help us live more fully by it at certain periods in history e.g. the appearances of Our Lady.
