The Year of Faith: from the Catechism of the Catholic Church (slightly adapted).

Paragraph 601: Citing a confession of faith that he himself had 'received', St. Paul professes that 'Christ died for our sins *in accordance with the scriptures*'. In particular Jesus' redemptive death fulfils Isaiah's prophecy of the suffering Servant. Indeed Jesus himself explained the meaning of his life and death in the light of God's suffering Servant. After his Resurrection he gave this interpretation of the Scriptures to the disciples at Emmaus, and then to the apostles.

Paragraph 605: The Church, following the apostles, teaches that Christ died for all without exception: 'There is not, never has been, and never will be a single human being for whom Christ did not suffer.'

Paragraph 611: The Eucharist that Christ institutes at the Last Supper will be the memorial of his own sacrifice. Jesus includes the apostles in his own offering and bids them perpetuate it. By doing so, the Lord institutes his apostles as priests of the New Covenant: 'For their sakes I sanctify myself, so that they also may be sanctified in truth.'
