

The Year of Faith: from the Catechism of the Catholic Church (slightly adapted).

- Paragraph 647: No one was an eyewitness to Christ's Resurrection and no evangelist describes it. No one can say how it came about physically. Although the Resurrection was an historical event that could be verified by the sign of the empty tomb and by the reality of the apostles' encounters with the risen Christ, still it remains at the very heart of the mystery of the faith as something that transcends and surpasses history.
- Paragraph 651: 'If Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain.' The Resurrection above all constitutes the confirmation of all Christ's works and teachings. All truths, even those most inaccessible to human reason, find their justification in Christ by his Resurrection has given the definitive proof of his divine authority, which he had promised.
- Paragraph 652: Christ's Resurrection is *the fulfilment of the promises* both of the Old Testament and of Jesus himself during his earthly life. The phrase 'in accordance with the Scriptures' indicates that Christ's Resurrection fulfilled these predictions.
- Paragraph 653: The truth of *Jesus' divinity* is confirmed by his Resurrection. He had said: 'When you have lifted up the Son of man, then you will know that I am he.' The Resurrection of the crucified one shows that he was truly 'I AM', the Son of God and God himself.
- Paragraph 655: Finally, Christ's Resurrection – and the risen Christ himself – is the principle and source of *our future resurrection*: 'Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep...For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ all shall be made alive'.



† Easter is here at last. Jesus lives. Alleluia = Praise the Lord.

† Hymn Books: Ours have become rather shabby and out of date. I have done a consultation exercise with our musicians and liturgists and asked

advice from priests and musicians. Almost unanimously they advised getting the revised edition of the Celebration Hymnal for Everyone. This new edition, approved by the Bishops' Conference, has a smart plastic cover and also contains the Mass settings we often use. There is also an Order of Mass and so we will no longer have to give out Mass cards.

- † In spite of getting a large discount and an extra discount for early payment, equipping two churches has not been cheap. To help finance this major purchase I am inviting you to buy a label, to be inserted in a hymn book in memory of a loved one. If you are interested, please take a form, fill it in and return with £5.
- † The second Sunday of Easter is Divine Mercy Sunday, an excellent chance to fulfil your Easter duty if you have not already done so. Divine Mercy will be celebrated at Lanherne Convent (St. Mawgan, near Newquay) and Plymouth Cathedral from 2.30 pm.
- † The annual Cornish Pilgrimage to Walsingham takes place from 27th October to 2nd November. For details please see the notice.
- † Thanks to all those who made the soup, helped to serve and wash up, or who simply came to enjoy the Lenten Lunch held jointly with the United Reform Church in Bude last week. £266 was raised for the Emmaus project in Cornwall, which will eventually provide training, work and shelter for the homeless. The project plans to open (initially in a small way) later this year. Please continue to remember this very worthy – and local- cause in your prayers.
