The Year of Faith: from the Catechism of the Catholic Church (slightly adapted).

Paragraph 452: The name Jesus means 'God saves'. The child born of the Virgin Mary is called Jesus, 'for he will save his people from their sins' (Mt. 1:21): 'there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved' (Acts 4:12).

Paragraph 453: The title 'Christ' means 'Anointed One' (Messiah). Jesus is the Christ, for 'God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power' (Acts 10:38). He was the one 'who is to come' (Lk 7:19), the object of 'the hope of Israel' (Acts 28:20).

Paragraph 454: The title 'Son of God' signifies the unique and eternal relationship of Jesus Christ to God his Father: he is the only Son of the Father (cf. Jn 1:14, 18; 3:16,18); he is God himself (cf. Jn 1:1). To be a Christian, one must believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God (cf. Acts 8:37; Jn 2:23).



- ❖ Please pray for the repose of the soul of Louise O'Connell, the mother of Fr. Kevin, who died recently. Her Requiem Mass took place last Friday at Bude. A Funeral Service for Caroline McQuaide, formerly of Launceston, also took place last Friday at Launceston.
- ❖ Thank you to all of you who made my birthday celebrations on 9th June so memorable. Grateful thanks for your cards, presents, good wishes and cash donations at both ends of the Parish. These came to nearly £400. Thank you for the wonderful buffet lunch, attended by about 90 people, and for making my guests from Torbay and Sclerder so welcome. Even the weather was splendid, for once. Several parishioners have let me see their photos. If there are any more, let me have a look. This event should be remembered in our Parish Archive.

- ❖ At Bude an Application to improve our church building is now on display. One of the trees near our car park withered and died. It has now been felled.

there will be a site meeting of our architect and members of the Liturgy Commission at which they will, I hope, approve our plans to renovate the inside of Launceston church and its surroundings.
