The Year of Faith: from the Catechism of the Catholic Church (slightly adapted).

- Paragraph 857: The Church is apostolic because she is founded on the apostles, in three ways:
- she was and remains built on ‘the foundation of the apostles’, the witnesses chosen and sent on mission by Christ himself;
 - with the help of the Spirit dwelling in her, the Church keeps and hands on the teaching, the ‘good deposit’, the salutary words she has heard from the apostles;
 - she continues to be taught, sanctified and guided by the apostles until Christ’s return, through their successors in pastoral office: the college of bishops, ‘assisted by priests, in union with the successor of Peter, the Church’s supreme pastor’.
- Paragraph 870: ‘The sole Church of Christ which in the Creed we profess to be one, holy, catholic and apostolic, ... subsists in the Catholic Church, which is governed by the successor of Peter and by the bishops in communion with him. Nevertheless, many elements of sanctification and of truth are found outside its visible confines’
- Paragraph 936: The Lord made St. Peter the visible foundation of his Church. He entrusted the keys of the Church to him. The bishop of the Church of Rome, successor to St. Peter, is ‘head of the college of bishops, the Vicar of Christ and Pastor of the universal Church on earth’.
- Paragraph 938: The bishops, established by the Holy Spirit, succeed the apostles. They are ‘the visible source and foundation of unity in their own particular Churches’.
- Paragraph 939: Helped by the priests, their co-workers, and by the deacons, the bishops have the duty of authentically teaching the faith, celebrating divine worship, above all the Eucharist, and guiding their churches as true pastors. Their responsibility also includes concern for all the Churches, with and under the Pope.
