The Year of Faith: from the Catechism of the Catholic Church (slightly adapted).

Paragraph 1905: In keeping with the social nature of man, the good of each individual is necessarily related to the common good, which in turn can be defined only in reference to the human person.

Paragraph 1939: The principle of solidarity, also articulated in terms of 'friendship' or 'social charity', is a direct demand of human and Christian brotherhood.

Paragraph 1944: Respect for the human person considers the other 'another self'. It presupposes respect for the fundamental rights that flow from the intrinsic dignity of the person.

Paragraph 1948: Solidarity is an eminently Christian virtue. It practises the sharing of spiritual goods even more than material ones.



- ❖ The Parish Audit and Site Visit by our architect and members of the Liturgy Commission on 5<sup>th</sup> July was reasonably successful, but I breathed a long sigh of relief when our visitors departed. Many thanks to Dave Thomas and Ann Reece-Pinchin, and to our parish reps led by Peter Hazard. We continue to inch towards the implementation of the building programme.
- ❖ Annual collection for the Secular Clergy Fund: you raised £471.22. Thank you for your generosity.
- ❖ Plans for the interior of St. Cuthbert Mayne church: following the earlier Parish Consultation regarding our external building plans, we are now ready to present plans for the church interior. We have three alternative proposals and I am keen that there should be a full and frank discussion of these. Without your wholehearted approval, the Bishop will quite rightly not let the project go ahead.
- ❖ The Ordinariate of Our Lady of Walsingham, which is well represented in this Diocese, has asked whether they can come to Launceston on pilgrimage on Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> September. I believe

this is a great honour for our parish, and I hope to be able to count on your support. More details will be publicised when available.

- ❖ Coffee morning on Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> July at the URC Hall from 10.30am, in aid of "Open the Book".
- ❖ Fr. David Gassor or Father David I, Parish Priest from 2001 until his illness in April 2009, is in the process of leaving Bude for Topsham, near Exeter. I feel we ought to offer him a small token of our appreciation of his ministry. There will be a retiring collection for the next few weeks: just cash, no envelopes, no Gift Aid, whatever you can afford.
- ❖ First Holy Communion for children of 7-8 years, and Confirmation for young people of 14 plus. I hope to begin programmes this September leading to celebratory Masses during the season of Easter. Parents who are interested should ask me for details over the next few weeks.
- ❖ Starting from this Sunday, there will be a small exhibition of photos from our Parish Archives in the Charles Langdon Room. I plan to change the display about once a month just to give you some idea of what we have in our collection of photos.
- ❖ Parish key-holders: I am trying to update my list of those of you who have been entrusted with various keys to our buildings, mainly for insurance purposes. Please check the current list with me so we can bring it up to date.
