From the Catechism of the Catholic Church (slightly adapted).

Paragraph 1939: The principle of solidarity, also articulated in terms of 'friendship' or 'social charity', is a direct demand of human and Christian brotherhood.

Paragraph 2319: Every human life, from the moment of conception until death, is sacred because the human person has been willed for its own sake in the image and likeness of the living and holy God.

Paragraph 2308: All citizens and all governments are obliged to work for the avoidance of war.

However, 'as long as the danger of war persists and there is no international authority with the necessary competence and power, governments cannot be denied the right of lawful self-defence, once all peace efforts have failed'.



❖ Confirmation Class 2014: Bishop Mark is unable to be with us on Sunday 27th April as planned. He has asked us to accept Sunday 15th June instead. I hope this alteration will not create a problem for anyone. Next meeting: Wednesday 12th March, same time, same place.

❖ First Holy Communion 2014: The Mass planned for Pentecost Sunday, 8th June, remains unchanged. Next meeting: Tuesday 11th March, same time, same place.

❖ Building works:

Launceston: despite the appalling weather, work has continued. The new drive is, literally, taking shape and work on the new garage/store-room continues. Huge mounds of earth have been removed. A temporary perimeter fence is under construction.

Bude: the outdoor work on the extension is now complete. The inside is being fitted out and painted, and the new door into the church will be fitted next week.

❖ Launceston: I have scrounged from Bude two comfortable chairs with armrests for the use of disabled people who need help in

getting up, and a small pew for the Shrine chapel. This is to comply fully with recent legislation.

- ❖ I have placed in the Sacristy at both churches a copy of Bishop Mark's ordination date, and coat of arms and motto: "In manus tuas, Domine". These were the last words spoken by St. Cuthbert Mayne and they are an echo of the words spoken on Calvary by Christ himself.
- ❖ Bude. Have you filled in the Neighbourhood Plan Survey (www.budestrattonnp.org), or see Lea after Mass
- ❖ Monday 24th February: an Ecumenical Service to mark the 475th anniversary of the Dissolution of Launceston Priory (24th February 1539) at 7pm in St. Thomas' Church. Hot drinks and snacks provided after the Service by the local Girl Guides. Come and support us.
- ❖ Lenten Station Mass on Thursday 13th March at 7pm at Truro Catholic Church. The main concelebrant is Bishop Mark. Everyone is welcome.
- ❖ Women's World Day of Prayer (Launceston) to be held in St. Cuthbert Mayne church on Friday 7th March at 2.30pm. All welcome, including men. Refreshments available afterwards.
- ❖ Women's World Day of Prayer (Holsworthy) will be held at St. Peter and St. Paul Parish Church at 11am on Friday 7th March, followed by a Bring & Share lunch. The Bude service will be held at St. Olaf's Church, Poughill at 10.30am on Friday 7th March. Men are very welcome.
- ❖ Salesian Day at Falmouth, Saturday 1st March. See poster for details.
- ❖ The annual Plymouth Diocesan Pilgrimage to Lourdes takes place from 23rd – 30th May 2014. Bishop Mark will lead this, so book a place and get to know him. There is also a Youth Pilgrimage at the same time, for young adults of 14+ at a much reduced rate. See posters for details, or ask me. I try to go to Lourdes every year and it would be a real joy to take some of you with me. Do give this matter some thought.
