From the Catechism of the Catholic Church (slightly adapted).

Paragraph 1410: It is Christ himself, the eternal High Priest of the New Covenant who, acting through the ministry of the priests, offers the Eucharistic sacrifice. And it is the same Christ, really present under the species of bread and wine, who is the offering of the Eucharistic sacrifice.

Paragraph 1413: By the consecration the transubstantiation of the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ is brought about. Under the consecrated species of bread and wine Christ himself, living and glorious, is present in a true, real and substantial manner: his Body and his Blood, with his soul and his divinity.

Paragraph 1415: Anyone who desires to receive Christ in Eucharistic communion must be in the state of grace. Anyone aware of having sinned mortally must not receive communion without having received absolution in the sacrament of Penance.

Paragraph 1418: Because Christ himself is present in the sacrament of the altar, he is to be honoured with the worship of adoration. *‘To visit the Blessed Sacrament is...a proof of our gratitude, an expression of love, and a duty of adoration toward Christ our Lord’*
