From the Catechism of the Catholic Church (slightly adapted):

- Paragraph 541: 'Now after John was arrested, Jesus came into Galilee, preaching the gospel of God, and saying: "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand: repent, and believe in the gospel."
- Paragraph 543: Everyone is called to enter the kingdom.
- Paragraph 544: The kingdom belongs to the poor and lowly, which means those who have accepted it with humble hearts.
- Paragraph 545: Jesus invites sinners to the table of the kingdom: 'I came not to call the righteous, but sinners.'
- Paragraph 546: Jesus' invitation to enter his kingdom comes in the form of parables, a characteristic feature of his teaching. Through his parables he invites people to the feast of the kingdom, but he also asks for a radical choice: to gain the kingdom, one must give everything.



- ❖ Some candidates for First Holy Communion classes have "emerged". So far, we have about five candidates. Are there any more? Classes will begin soon, probably on Thursday evenings. Possible candidates for Confirmation are still rather too young, so we will wait until 2016.
- ❖ The next in Fr. Christopher's series of Quiet Days entitled 'The Lord's Prayer under the microscope' takes place in the Violet Evelyn Hall in Southgate on Saturday 4th October. The title of this day is '*Give us this day...what are we really asking for?*' The day runs from 10.00am to 4.00pm and includes refreshments and a light lunch. As well as the talk and instruction by Fr. Christopher, there is the opportunity for some group discussion, individual quiet time, Mass and Confession (if desired). See poster for details.
- ❖ Next Saturday, 27th September, a group of Ministers of Holy Communion from Newquay led by their Parish Priest Fr. Brian Kenwick will visit Launceston for a Day of Recollection, beginning with

Mass at 11.00am. Confessions will be from 10am to 10.30am. After Mass, I shall give a short talk on St. Cuthbert Mayne in the Charles Langdon Room. You are invited to come to the Mass, which replaces the usual 10am celebration, and the talk.
