From the Catechism of the Catholic Church (slightly adapted):

Paragraph 2046: By living with the mind of Christ, Christians hasten to coming of the Reign of God, 'a kingdom of justice, love and peace'. They do not, for all that, abandon their earthly tasks; faithful to their master, they fulfil them with uprightness, patience and love.

Paragraph 2075: 'What good deed must I do, to have eternal life?' – 'If you would enter into life, keep the commandments' (Mt. 19: 16-17).

Paragraph 2082: What God commands he makes possible by his grace.

Paragraph 2083: Jesus summed up man's duties toward God in this saying: 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This immediately echoes the solemn call: 'Hear, O Israel: the LORD our God is one LORD.'

God has loved us first. The love of the One God is recalled in the first of the 'ten words'. The Commandments then make explicit the response of love that man is called to give to his God.

Paragraph 2196: Love does no wrong to a neighbour; therefore love is the fulfilling of the law.
