From the Catechism of the Catholic Church (slightly adapted):

- Paragraph 680: Christ the Lord already reigns through the Church, but all the things of this world are not yet subjected to him. The triumph of Christ's kingdom will not come about without one last assault by the powers of evil.
- Paragraph 681: On Judgement Day at the end of the world, Christ will come in glory to achieve the definitive triumph of good over evil which, like the wheat and the tares, have grown up together in the course of history.
- Paragraph 682: When he comes at the end of time to judge the living and the dead, the glorious Christ will reveal the secret disposition of hearts and will render to each man according to his works, and according to his acceptance or refusal of grace.



- ❖ Following the removal of the old organ pipes at Launceston, the redundant metal bars have been removed, the hole in the wall filled and the flooring near the console strengthened and renewed.
- ❖ The organ builder, David Gridley, has sent some photos of work in progress. These are in the Charles Langdon Room.
- ❖ Two nuns with whom I worked in Plymouth have given me a relic of St. Edmund Campion, one of the Forty Martyrs of England and Wales. I have placed the reliquary in the Shrine.

- ❖ I have been asked to be responsible for Mass at Callington with effect from Advent Sunday. Mass there will be on Sundays at 5pm and will not affect the schedule at Bude and Launceston. This new time may be helpful for those of you who cannot get to Sunday morning Mass because of work. Please be patient with me if I take even longer than usual to get things done!
