From the Catechism of the Catholic Church (slightly adapted):

Paragraph 430: Jesus means in Hebrew: 'God saves.' At the annunciation, the angel Gabriel gave him the name Jesus as his proper name, which expresses both his identity and his mission.

Paragraph 432: The name 'Jesus' signifies that the very name of God is present in the person of his Son, made man for the universal and definitive redemption from sins.

Paragraph 436: The word '*Christ*' comes from the Greek translation of the Hebrew *Messiah*, which means 'anointed'. It became the name proper to Jesus only because he accomplished perfectly the divine mission that 'Christ' signifies.

Paragraph 443: Peter could recognise the transcendent character of the Messiah's divine sonship because Jesus had clearly allowed it to be so understood.
