From the Catechism of the Catholic Church (slightly adapted):

Paragraph 984: The Creed links ‘the forgiveness of sins’ with its profession of faith in the Holy Spirit, for the risen Christ entrusted to the apostles the power to forgive sins when he gave them the Holy Spirit.

Paragraph 986: By Christ’s will, the Church possesses the power to forgive the sins of the baptised and exercises it through bishops and priests normally in the sacrament of Penance.

Paragraph 1443: During his public life Jesus not only forgave sins, but also made plain the effect of this forgiveness: he reintegrated forgiven sinners into the community of the People of God from which sin had alienated or even excluded them.
