- vii. You grow spiritually with each moment you spend with Jesus! "Our communal worship at Mass must go together with our personal worship of Jesus in Eucharistic adoration in order that our love may be complete." (Pope John Paul II, Redeemer of Man)
- viii. The best time you spend on earth is with Jesus, your Best Friend, in the Blessed Sacrament! "How great is the value of conversation with Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, for there is nothing more consoling on earth, nothing more efficacious for advancing long the road of holiness!" (Pope Paul VI, *Mysterium Fidei*)

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church (slightly adapted):

Paragraph 1334: In the Old Covenant bread and wine were offered in sacrifice among the first fruits of the earth, as a sign of grateful acknowledgement to the Creator.

Paragraph 1335: The miracles of the multiplication of the loaves, when the Lord says the blessing, breaks and distributes the loaves through his disciples to feed the multitude, prefigure the superabundance of this unique bread of the Eucharist. The sign of water turned into wine at Cana already announces the Hour of Jesus' glorification. It makes manifest the fulfilment of the wedding feast in the Father's kingdom, where the faithful will drink the new wine that has become the Blood of Christ.
