## **ADOREMUS- The Eucharist and Evangelisation**

Evangelisation is not primarily the finding out about doctrines and dogmas but the invitation for an encounter with a person, Jesus Christ. One way for this encounter to happen is through faithful witnesses; those who have received and have the desire to pass this on. Adoration is a time of encounter when we spend time getting to know Christ better. This, in turn, returns us to the Mass where Christ reveals himself most of all. And it is from the Mass that we are sent out to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ to the whole of creation.

From the Apostolic Exhortation of Pope Francis *Evangelii Gaudium* he says, "In their own way, all these instances of joy flow from the infinite love of God, who has revealed himself to us in Jesus Christ. I never tire of repeating those words of Benedict the XVI which take us to the very heart of the Gospel. Being a Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and decisive direction..." Here we find the source and inspiration of all our efforts at evangelisation. For if we have received the love which restores meaning to our lives, how can we fail to share that love with others?
