ADOREMUS (7th-9th September)

The bishops of England and Wales are holding a National Eucharistic Pilgrimage and Congress in Liverpool in September 2018. Eucharistic Congresses are gatherings of clergy, religious and laity which promote an awareness of the central place of the Eucharistic in the life and mission of the Church. The last International Eucharistic Congress in England was held in 1908 when permission for a public procession of the Blessed Sacrament was refused. Participants will engage in a series of sessions focusing on different dimensions of the Eucharist and the daily celebration and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Four representatives and Fr John from this parish are going to this event, please pray for them and for an increase in devotion to Our Lord Jesus Christ, present in the Blessed Sacrament.
