A grace-filled weekend. 10,000 people gathered for the Symposium in Liverpool Echo Arena on the Saturday, and thousands again gathered for the Masses at Liverpool Cathedral followed by the Blessed Sacrament Procession around the streets of Liverpool.

One of our St Cuthbert Mayne banners was carried, and prominently displayed throughout the Procession. A deluge of rain did nothing to dampen the spirits of those who processed.
