Live simply – to live in a world without litter and plastic pollution, where nature thrives

Bude Beach Clean Thursday 18th July

Eight parishioners from Bude and Launceston came together on a gloriously sunny day to take part in a beach clean event as part of our Live Simply award. It was a bespoke session kindly hosted by the '2 Minute Foundation', a national charity who are environmental educators highlighting the detrimental effects that plastics have on the environment. We were told about the microplastics and nurdles.

Nurdles, or plastic 'pellets', are tiny granules of plastic less than 5 millimeters in size that are used in industry to manufacture all kinds of plastic products. These tiny particles are ending up in our food chain! In the EU alone, up to 23 billion plastic nurdles end up in the environment every day. In one year, this amounts to an inconceivable 8 trillion nurdles that equates to 160 million kilos.





Five of the group then went on to Summerleaze Beach and within a few minutes we had all collected cups full of microplastics and a few nurdles, while the remainder of the group stayed on the cliff top and spent time painting excellent scenic watercolours.

Listening to the sea we were asked to close our eyes and express what we felt – so many descriptive words described that moment; peaceful and soporific!!. We ended the session by visiting the rockpools on Crooklets Beach. We saw a shrimp or two and learnt which of the seaweeds were edible.

It was a very worthwhile, rewarding, and educational experience. A huge thank you to Claire from the '2 Minute Foundation' for her time and Margaret Coles for organising the afternoon.

World Day Against Trafficking in Persons - 30th July

The 30th July is the annual World Day Against Trafficking in Persons, which is an event to raise awareness and increase prevention of people trafficking and modern day slavery.

The theme this year is, 'Leave no child behind in the fight against human trafficking'. One in three victims of trafficking are children, with girls being disproportionality affected. Children are also twice as likely to be subjected to violence during trafficking than adults. Children will experience various forms of trafficking including forced labour, criminality or begging, online and sexual abuse and exploitation, and being trafficked for illegal adoption.
