Live Simply – view “the Letter” Saturday 27th July, Launceston

A group of enthusiastic parishioners from Launceston came together to view “The Letter” as part of our Live Simply award. The film inspired by the teachings of Pope Benedict and Pope Francis strives to explain the complexity of climate change but also aims to offer a message of hope. The film is very much connected with ‘Caring for Our Common Home’.

We are all aware of the extreme weather conditions that seem to be becoming more frequent. Two years ago, we had a drought in Cornwall. Dartmoor annual average rainfall is 1800mm, so far this year it has experienced 2800mm already. In other parts of the world heatwaves, wildfires, floods, earthquakes and droughts are happening all too often. Nature is crying out to all of us for help.



The whole activity was thought provoking, generating a huge amount of discussion about how we can understand, and help to combat climate change. The message in the film was very stimulating and moving. We can't do this in isolation, we need to listen to each other and respect everyone's point of view. The world is not ours to own, it's ours on loan.

Similar events will be planned in Bude and Callington, dates to be published in the newsletter. The work already being undertaken by the Diocese and Parish will be made available to all parishioners in the coming months showing that there is HOPE for our future.

In 2019 Rob was made an Honoured Burgess of the Town of Launceston in recognition of his considerable contribution to the Town. Rob has been our Town Cryer for 45 years*
