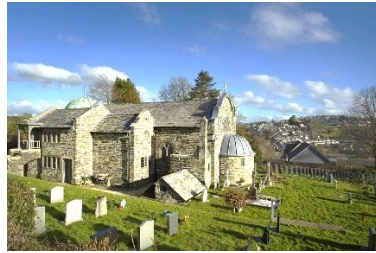

Live Simply – Churches Together



A time for coming together, a Community Songs of Praise, was held in St Paternus Church, South Petherwin on Sunday 25th August as part of their village's week long Flowerpot Festival.

The afternoon began with a welcome from Canon Olive Stevens, who had extended an invitation to Canon John Deeny to participate. It was wonderful to see the coming together of a large number of parishioners encompassing St Paternus, the Methodist Church and St Cuthbert Mayne. We learned some of the history of St Paternus Church which has a font from the Norman period, a Jacobean pulpit and Victorian altar. There is also one remaining original stained glass from before the Disillusionment of the Monasteries. Several villagers stood up and spoke about how important community is to them and what goes on in and around the parish, each choosing a hymn of meaning to them. The hymns were so uplifting especially that sung by the soloist, Deborah Adams.



Father John spoke of how St Paternus is on the route for Cornish pilgrims and that our own church of St Cuthbert Mayne is also a place of pilgrimage. We have come a long way on our journey as Christians since then and it was wonderful that we can now come together and make our journey to the heavenly Kingdom side by side.

He also said, as fellow Christians we may not yet be in full communion with each other, that might take some time yet, but Jesus is at work among us leading and guiding us, our Good Shepherd on our pilgrim journey. Let us listen to the Holy Spirit, the Spirit, not of division, but of unity and peace. As we continue to make this journey trusting in God, following his Son, proclaiming the Good News.

Our holy father, Pope Francis has designated next year, 2025, as a Jubilee Year. The theme is Pilgrims of Hope, which is a very appropriate theme for these troubled times in our world, because our Christian faith offers a hope, the world cannot give. As fellow Christian pilgrims of hope we offered up the Jubilee prayer, followed by prayers for the occasion read by Pamela Boucher.

The afternoon was a true coming together of the community after which parishioners stopped and had conversations with each other before leaving the Church. What a wonderful occasion it was.
