I sincerely regret this delay and offer my apologies to all who are disappointed and inconvenienced. However it is important that everything is properly in place and due process observed.

While this process takes place no further comment will be made."

Visit of Ben Maguire MP Sunday 3rd November



We welcomed our Parliamentary Member for North Cornwall, Ben Maguire, to St Cuthbert Mayne to Mass on Sunday 3rd November.

Having been in contact with Ben during the election campaign earlier this year where we asked specific questions regarding domestic poverty, tackling global poverty, climate change and the growing debt crisis faced by low-income countries, he responded saying that he would be happy to discuss further if elected.

After Mass and coffee where Ben met parishioners, a small group had further discussions which particularly focused on the global debt crisis given that next year is a Jubilee year called 'Pilgrims of Hope'. It will be a year of hope for a world suffering the impacts of war, the climate crisis and the new world debt crisis. As Catholics we believe that all people should be able to live their life with respect.



Referencing information from Kayode Akintola's recent visit to the parish we highlighted the severe impact of the debt crisis in Africa. 25 countries in Africa are facing unsustainable debt burdens. In 2023 Africa's debt was 1.13 trillion dollars, 45% of their revenues go on debt repayment and interest. The world needs a change in moral values which have been eroded by profiteers.

Assisted Dying Bill

Some serious concerns: Assisted suicide could pressure the most vulnerable, including the elderly and disabled, to end their lives, feeling they are a burden. Legalisation might normalise assisted suicide, shifting it from a right to an expected duty for those who feel burdensome.

Legalisation could undermine palliative care, with lethal injection seen as cheaper and easier than caring for the terminally ill, undermining the UK's leadership in compassionate end-of-life care. Such a law would place medical staff in a morally compromising position, shifting their role from caregivers to participants in ending life. The relationship between medical staff and patients would fundamentally change.

Once legalised, euthanasia laws expand to include more groups, as seen in Canada, where 5% of deaths now result from lethal injection. 'Safeguards' are not to be trusted. For Catholics, human life is sacred and protecting it from conception to natural death is a core belief. While the Church understands the desperation that may lead some to suicide, it holds that life is a gift, and purposely ending it prematurely is a grave act against God and humanity.

World day of the Poor: The Eighth world day of the Poor is on **Sunday 17 November**. In his [message for this World Day of the Poor](#), the Holy Father reiterates that "*the poor hold a privileged place in God's heart*" and invites everyone to learn to pray for the poor and to pray together with the poor, with humility and trust.

We know that poverty is a significant issue both in the UK and globally. In the week running up to World Day of the Poor, we are all encouraged to pray, reflect and engage in concrete actions against poverty by deepening our encounter with the poor in our communities and considering how we can respond to their needs. We can all take small actions that together make a big difference.
